SCHOOL UNIFORM

As we near the end of another school year, it seems to be an appropriate time to remind everyone of our Uniform Code to ensure that all students are correctly attired now and in September.

As you are aware, we have a strict uniform policy at Campion School and this must be adhered to by every student.

The following dress will be expected from all students in Years 7-11. Year 11 will be expected to wear full school uniform up to and including their exams. No exceptions will be tolerated.

Should a student be 'out' of uniform, then our usual policy will be applied. A detention served at lunchtime and no stamps will be given in the planner for uniform for that day. Students may be asked to remove items and these may be confiscated until the end of the day.

Campion School Uniform

Boys	Girls
Black trousers	Black trousers or skirt
Black shoes/black socks	Black shoes/black socks
White shirt	White blouse with revered collar/shirt – which must be able to be 'tucked in'
Campion school tie	Black blazer with school badge
Black blazer with school badge	Tights: plain black or skin coloured

School badge and Campion School tie can only be ordered from Campion School

Blazers

For both boys and girls, blazers must be of a traditional style. Fitted, short waited black jackets are not acceptable. Blazers can be bought from a range of stockists. However, the blazer supplied from Campion School is a good quality garment at an affordable price with the badge embroidered on.

Campion Jumper

Students may wear a Campion V-neck jumper under their blazer for extra warmth in very cold weather. These jumpers are green for KS3 (Years 7 and 8) and black for KS4 (Years 9, 10 and 11) and are available only from Campion School. Black cardigans are not school uniform and should not be worn.

Shirts

Shirts for both boys and girls must be of a traditional style and must be of a suitable style and length so they TUCK INTO TROUSERS/SKIRTS. For girls, decorative blouses, 3/4 length sleeves and uncovered flesh around the midriff are not acceptable. Coloured T shirts/vest tops are not to be worn underneath shirts.



Trousers and Skirts

Trousers for both boys and girls must be of a traditional style, plain black material (not denim, canvas or corduroy) and tailored. Hipster style, tight fitting or combat style trousers and decorative or coloured belts are not acceptable. Skirts should be knee-length (as a guide 1 inch/2cm off the floor when kneeling). They are not to be 'body con skirts' or of stretch material that will 'ride up', or with slits at the sides.

Shoes

Shoes for both boys and girls should be PLAIN BLACK. Trainers, canvas pumps, high heels, toe-less, sling back or backless (flip flop type) shoes are not acceptable.

Jewellery

For safety reasons, we only allow the following jewellery:

- One pair of sleepers or stud earrings
- A watch
- A necklace of religious value
- One small ring

***No facial piercings will be allowed whilst in school.
During PE lessons, we ask students to remove all jewellery.***

Make-up and Hair


Make up should be discreet and natural looking. If we feel this is excessive, students will be sent to their DSLP/Key Stage Manager to remove it. We will provide make up remover and nail varnish remover. We advise that all students have a conventional hair style and we ask that any hair-style is in a natural tone. No large embellishments (no larger than a 50p piece), are to be worn.

The uniform has been agreed by students, staff and parents.
